2 Thessalonians 3:1-18

1. What prayer requests do Paul share in 3:1-2?
 - a. That the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, as it was with them.
 - b. That they may be delivered from wicked and evil people who don't have faith.

2. What affirmations does Paul give to the Thessalonians in 3:3-5?
 - a. He tells them that the Lord is faithful.
 - b. He tells them that the Lord will strengthen and protect them from the evil one.
 - c. He tells them about his confidence that they are doing and will continue to do the things Paul has commanded.
 - d. He blesses them again by asking God to direct their hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance.

3. What does Paul say next, according to 3:6?
 - a. He commands them to stay away from every believer who is idle and disruptive.
 - b. He commands them to stay away from believers that don't live according to the teaching they received from him.

4. How, according to 3:7-8, did Paul and his companions live among them?
